
Through being the leading provider of quality teacher education in Jordan and the region, we enable teachers to achieve more than they thought possible.

Teacher Education Professional Diploma (TEPD)

The Teacher Education Professional Diploma (TEPD) was designed in partnership with the Institute of Education-University College London. Since 2016, it has prepared future educators to view the classroom as more than a mere space, but as the birthplace of innovation, leadership, intellectual curiosity, and civic participation. The Diploma combines theory and an extensive school practicum for future and novice teachers of early grades (1–3) and grades 4 and above in Arabic, English, mathematics, and science.



Advanced Instructional Leadership Professional Diploma (AILPD)

DEVELOPED IN COOPERATION WITH THE UNIVERSITY OF CONNECTICUT

The Advanced Instructional Leadership Professional Diploma (AILPD), launched in 2016, is a 24-credit hour, nine-month accredited diploma offered by the Queen Rania Teacher Academy and awarded by the University of Jordan. The diploma aims to increase the conceptual understanding of instructional leadership in order to articulate a vision for the organization and lead learning to achieve that vision. It also helps develop strategies for school improvement through a close examination of curriculum, instruction, assessment practices, teacher development, culture, and school organization.

The AILPD targets:

- School principals
- Heads of departments
- Principal assistants
- Educational supervisors

Aspiring principals and future school leaders who wish to join the program must complete the pre-requisite module "An Introduction to Instructional Leadership."

■ Launch of "Tawazon" for Psychosocial Support Online Program

Launched in 2020, this offering stems from QRTA's commitment to a holistic approach to education that empowers educational and caregiving institutions to create a culture of wellbeing and inclusion.

The four-module program, which is offered online, supports educators and non-specialists in recognizing their own and their learners' psychosocial needs, equips them with the knowledge and skills to meet these needs, and enables them to adopt practices that ensure sustained psychosocial wellbeing.

Education for Environment Sustainability Program

This program was established in response to the pressing need to raise environmental awareness among school students and in direct relation to completion of the SDGs set by UNDP. It offers project and inquiry-based learning, along with the introduction of innovative and sustainable solutions elicited from learners. It focuses on dealing with local and common international environmental issues to increase sensitivity and awareness among learners of all ages, with the aim of promoting sustainable and effective learning. The program provides ways in which educators can incorporate environmental awareness and SDGs into the currently taught curricula.

These workshops are geared towards IB educators in Africa, Europe, and the Middle East.





Dilemmas in Schools: A Casebook for Educators

This publication was a written collaboration between QRTA and the Harvard Graduate School of Education Middle East Professional Learning Initiative (MEPLI) as part of the Professional Education Programs. This book was written to analyze the complex dilemmas educators face, evaluate the roles of educators and educational leaders, and envision how these roles will evolve in the future.



Schools Network Research Study (SNRS)

The SNRS aims to examine the impact of the QRTA School Networks for Instructional Improvement on teaching practices in four subjects: Arabic, English, mathematics, and science. The study also addresses the impact of SNRS on instructional leadership practices and on students' learning outcomes in the four subjects in the study schools over the course of three years.



Online Learning Experience at QRTA: Results and Ways Forward

The evaluation aims to examine the quality of the online learning experience at QRTA during the COVID-19 lockdown.

QRTA beneficiaries and the academic team members found online learning experience beneficial, productive, and it provided valuable opportunities in online learning despite challenging circumstances.



Cultivating Inclusive & Supportive Learning Environments (CISLE) - phase II

The evaluation study aims to measure the impact of the QRTA Psychosocial Support, Interactive Pedagogies, and Model Community Schools programs on improving the educational environment among students and raising the awareness of inclusion in education among the school community members.

Innovation at QRTA

In 2020, QRTA established a Teacher Innovation Space and developed teacher innovation programs. During 2020, QRTA has witnessed major value-added improvements within its structure, enhancing innovation and technology:

Teacher Innovation Space at QRTA

Teacher Innovation Space at QRTA was launched to develop teachers' ability to support student innovation, creativity, and entrepreneurial skills.

The Innovation Program

The program aims to nourish and develop teachers' ability to support student innovation, creativity and entrepreneurial skills by engaging teachers in activities that encourage them to generate ideas, and prototype and model different solutions.

e-Learning Department

To comply with the changes in digital world education, there came a need to establish a department capable of keeping up with the new demands of future educators and students. QRTA's e-Learning Department ensures teaching excellence by integrating exemplary instructional design and state-of-the- art emerging technologies for a sustainable and innovative learning experience.



Entrepreneurship in Education

The concept was introduced through a teacher training program delivered by QRTA trainers in collaboration with Goethe Institute. Through the training, teachers were introduced to design thinking, market analysis, and business planning.

eTwinning

In collaboration with Madrasati, TEPD has joined one of the biggest teacher networks in the world. The program provides opportunities to collaborate, develop projects, and share good practices with teachers around the world.

Virtual Reality Simulations

QRTA introduced VR Simulation in professional training provided through a unique blend of artificial and human intelligence. Through this cutting-edge technology, educators interact with avatars in real-time and engage in complex exchanges that mimic the situations they would potentially face in actual learning environments.
